I am reviewing the application for a third term of LIHI Certification submitted by the Winooski One project, FERC No. P-2756, located at lower Winooski Falls on the Winooski River, between the cities of Winooski and Burlington, VT.

In past terms, our reviewer Gabriela Goldfarb had corresponded with Anthony Tur, who provided the following information:

As requested, we reviewed our records to determine if endangered species may be effected by the hydroelectric facility located in Winooski, Vermont. Our records indicate that no known occurrences, other than transient bald eagles, are documented at or downstream of the facility.

Can either of you let me know if this situation has changed in any way at this facility, or if there are any issues you are aware of related to threatened and endangered species?
