ERRATA NOTICE

(February 02, 2006)

On December 8, 2005, an “Order Approving Settlement and Issuing New License” was issued in the above-captioned docket. 113 FERC ¶ 62,186(2005). As indicated below, this notice makes corrections to the December 8, 2005 order.

(1) Article 412(e)(2) is revised to read:

Before conveying the interest, the licensee shall determine that the proposed use of the lands to be conveyed is not inconsistent with any approved Exhibit R or approved report on recreational resources of an Exhibit E; or, if the project does not have an approved Exhibit R or approved report on recreational resources, that the lands to be conveyed do not have recreational value.

(2) The last sentence of Paragraph 12 in the order is revised to read:

Pools that occasionally strand fish below Willamette Falls exist within the project boundary.

(3) Item # (3) of Paragraph 25 in the order is revised to read:

PGE is required to file with the Commission a plan to design, install, and operate a passive integrated transponder (PIT) tag interrogator system at T.W. Sullivan generating Unit 13 bypass; and to review the feasibility of installing PIT tag interrogators at the North siphon bypass and, if feasible, file with the Commission a plan to install this system.

(4) The second sentence of Paragraph 46 in the order is revised to read:

PGE would complete diffuser grate cleaning and removal of debris from diffuser chambers in all the fish ladder legs and pool 48 of the ladder and repair fishway joints on all three fish ladder legs.

(5) The second sentence of Paragraph 66 in the order is revised to read:

The BA determined that the proposed action with recommended measures would be likely to adversely affect ESA-listed Upper Willamette River (UWR) Chinook salmon, and UWR steelhead, and would not be likely to adversely affect ESA-listed Lower Columbia River (LCR) Chinook salmon, LCR steelhead and bald eagles.

(6) The second sentence of Paragraph 67 in the order is revised to read:

On December 15, 2004, the Commission requested that the NMFS include a conference opinion for LCR Coho salmon in its biological opinion on the proposed licensing of the project.
